How is Our School Development Plan Used?

- Guides ongoing assessment and review of goals and actions.
- Our school development plan is the driver for closing learning gaps and informs:
 - Instructional strategies
 - Professional learning
 - School structures and processes for learning
 - Resources to improve student learning
 - Data-informed decision making





School Development Plan – Overall Goal

- Our focus this year is to embed formative assessment practices into teaching and learning across all subject areas.
 - Teachers will deepen understandings of curriculum (particularly that which has been newly introduced) thus will:
 - Share clear learning intentions and goals for lessons
 - Plan and design learning tasks based on their knowledge of the learners in their classes to allow every student to have and entry point and success in their learning
 - Work with students to provide feedback (from self, peers, and teacher) to improve student learning
 - Students will be engaged in assessment processes:
 - understanding learning intentions
 - Identifying and using success criteria
 - giving and receiving feedback for learning





School Development Plan – Literacy Improvement

- Students will be engaged in the assessment process, particularly in writing through:
 - Understanding the goals and learning intentions of lessons and tasks (What will I learn and be able to do? Why am I doing this task?)
 - Using exemplars and working with their teacher to identify success criteria (What makes a great piece of writing?)
 - Use feedback (from self, peers, and teacher) to improve their writing. (What are my next steps?)
- We will monitor improvement in writing through:
 - Periodic monitoring of student growth in writing through common gradeteam assessments (ongoing, monthly)
 - Report card writing outcomes (January and June)
 - Monitoring government assessment data (October, January, May)







School Development Plan – Mathematics Improvement

- Students will be engaged in assessment processes in Mathematics through:
 - Clear learning intentions and goals in student friendly language, aligned to new curriculum (At the end of this lesson, I will understand.../ I will be able to...)

 - Engaging in numeracy tasks that build on their current level of knowledge and understanding
 - Use what they know about themselves as learners to choose tasks and entry points that allow them to have success and that will move them forward in their learning.
- We will monitor improvement in mathematics through:
 - Periodic monitoring of student growth through common grade team assessments (ongoing, monthly)
 - Alberta Numeracy assessment data (October, January, May)
 - Report Card outcome related to Number (January & June)







School Development Plan – Well-Being Improvement

- Through engagement in assessment processes, students will have an understanding of themselves and learners:
 - Students will set goals and work towards achieving them
 - Students will have an understanding of themselves as learners, thus will be able to engage in learning tasks and see how they are growing and improving
 - Students will have an appreciation for how they can contribute to the community with their unique gifts and talents and have the agency to ask for help when they need it
- We will monitor student well-being in these areas through:
 - Our School Survey Data (grades 4 & 5)- February and April
 - K-3 CBE Student Well-being survey (grade 3)- February and May
 - Teacher observations (K-2)

Our School Budget

- Our school received \$3,573,567 in 2023-24 to provide a quality education to our students and meet the goals in our school development plan (SDP).
- At least 75 per cent of budgeted funds covers staffing and the remaining portion covers instructional and operational supplies.

 Our student enrolment for the current year was 558 (Sept. 30) and is now 596 (Feb. 5).

School-based vs. Central CBE fees

School-based fees are fees charged at the school level for a specific activity, for example, field trip fees.

- *Central fees are those charged and managed at the system level. These fees include:
- Transportation fees
- Student supplies fee
- Lunch Supervision Fee and \$10 Activity Fee
- *Decisions about Central fees are not part of this online engagement because schools can not set or change these fees- they are set by CBE.





Our 2023-24 School Fees

We consult with families by outlining proposed activities for the upcoming year that may require a fee for cost recovery.

This year, we have charged school-based fees for:

- Field trips (including Open Minds*)
- * Open Minds was unique in that it was a week-long experience and we charged a flat rate subsidized fee of \$51.25 per student. Most field trips are single day and a lower fee, though not as heavily subsidized.
- We may also charge fees for some in-school activities before the end of the year (e.g. art or science activities that require special materials/ equipment, museo-kits, etc.)
- Or there may be a small fee associated with an optional club.







Our 2023-24 School Fees

School fees are only charged to cover the cost of an activity. Based on what we know at this time, fees for 2024-25 will be similar to what you see for this year.

We always aim to charge a minimum fee, meaning most fees will be less than the approved amount.

*You may see an increase in fees where the cost of an activity (or a material associated with the activity) has increased. We will work with our Parent Fundraising Association to help subsidize fees when necessary.
